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HKIA's strategic importance /1



Vital to HK's economy

- supports financial services, trading & logistics, tourism, exhibitions, regional headquarters, etc.
- over 30% of external trade in value terms by air


Supports 220,000 jobs

- 8% working population (2007)
- 60,000 workers within HKIA's perimeter fence
- 160,000 jobs in transport services, tourism, retail sectors related to air transport

HKIA's strategic importance /2




HKIA ranked 3rd in international passenger traffic for past 12 months

HKIA faces enormous challenges



Existing capacity approaching limits

- now at about 90% of permitted runway capacity
- will reach full capacity by 2017 (even with enhancement measures)


Building a new runway normally takes 10 years

- even if there is a decision in 2011 to build
- third runway won't be completed until 2021 4 years after saturation in 2017!!!

HKIA faces fierce competition from neighbours /2



- international cities covered by Guangzhou & Shenzhen increased by 34% & 100% respectively, well above 19% of HK
- total cities covered by Guangzhou & Shenzhen catching up with HK's

FedEx Asia-Pacific Hub in Guangzhou

- opened in 2009
- expected to bring US\$63 billion direct economic benefits to China by 2020

UPS Asia-Pacific Hub in Shenzhen

- opened in 2010
- 1.4 times larger than the old facility in the Philippines

HK's inability to meet air transport growth /1

Forecast annual growth over next decade

- Asia-Pacific: 7% both in passenger & cargo traffic
- Mainland: 11-14% in air traffic

Civil Aviation Administration of China's (CAAC) National Plan for Civil Airports (2008)

build 52 airports between 2011-2020

Private aircrafts in the Mainland

- forecast annual growth: 25%
- China will surpass US as the world's largest owner of private jets in 2020





CAAC's National Plan for Civil Airports (2008)



- Build 52 airports between 2011-2020
- A total of 244 airports by 2020



Implications?

HK will miss phenomenal growth in regional & international air traffic

additional flights will have to be turned away

Loss of dominant position of aviation hub & business centre

risk of losing existing business to competitors

The lesson of Tokyo Narita

serious & irrecoverable loss if we don't decide & act sooner!



The way forward /1

HK's success as an aviation hub due to timely & visionary decision in 1989 to build CLK airport

HKIC warmly welcomes AAHK's latest feasibility study on HKIA's development & public consultation exercise

Planning & construction need fast-tracking

if entire HKIA could be built (from decision to completion) in 8 years, HK should strive to build the third runway faster



The way forward /2

Issues such as noise, air quality & marine ecology will need to be addressed & can be addressed

2011 will mark a century of aviation in HK. What better way to ensure our future than by giving the greenlight to the third runway?
